



Written and Directed by Quentin Tarantino



Saturday • March 4 Fright Night (1985) [106 min.]

Directed by Tom Holland

Celebrate a Bat-tacular spectacular with themed midnights and kiddee matinees all throughout March! When Charley Brewster (William Ragsdale) discovers that his new next door neighbor is a vampire (a terrific, sexy Chris Sarandon), he'll have to convince a washed-up tv host (Roddy McDowall) to help put a stake through the bloodsucker's heart. Perfectly balanced between humor and horror, Tom Holland's Fright Night proves there are some very good reasons to be afraid of the dark.



Saturday • March 11 The Bat People (1974) [95 min.]

Saturday • March 18 Nightwing (1979) [105 min.]

Directed by Arthur Hiller

The day belongs to man but the night is theirs. Arthur Hiller directs an atmospheric creature feature that dives into the dead of night as a swarm of vampire bats turn their fangs toward an Indian reservation in New Mexico. As the winged killers spread terror, a policeman (Nick Mancuso), his girlfriend (Kathryn Harrold) and a scientist (David Warner) desperately try to stop them.

Nicolas Cage is at his most bug-eyed, outrageously over-the-top Cage-iest as an unhinged literary agent whose work-all-day, party-all-night lifestyle has dire consequences in this brilliant, pitch-black horror comedy. Following a neck-biting, late night hookup, Cage's fragile psyche shatters further and he becomes convinced he's turning into a vampire. But is his newfound thirst for blood and aversion to sunlight actually real or just psychosis?


March 18 & 19 at 2:00pm The Monster Squad (1987) [82 min.] Directed by Fred Dekker
