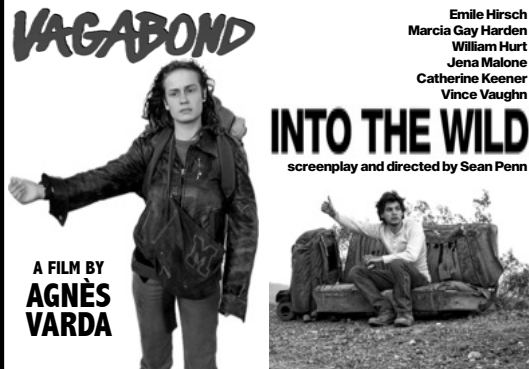

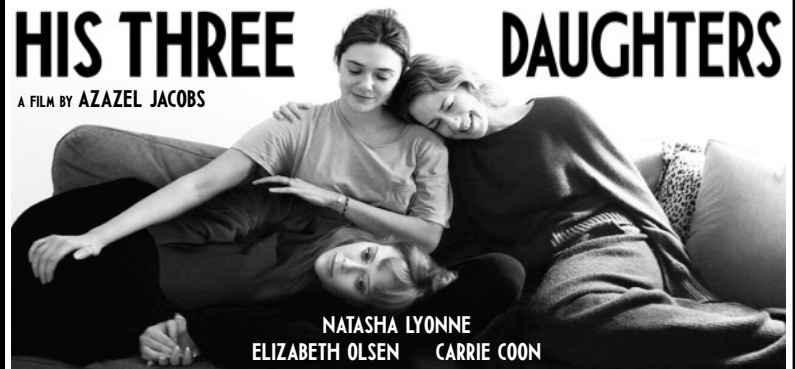

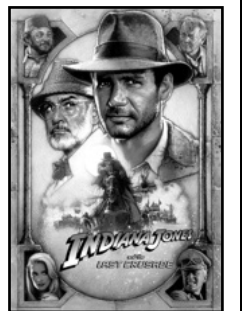


September 14 & 15 at 2:00pm

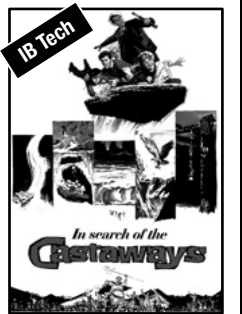


September 21 & 22 at 2:00pm
