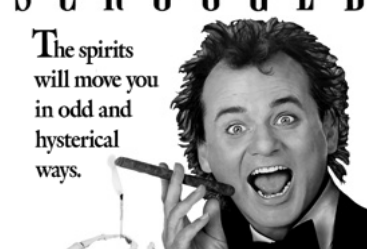

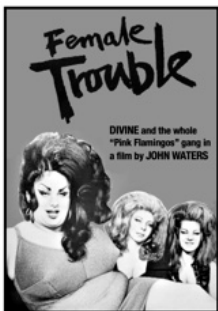

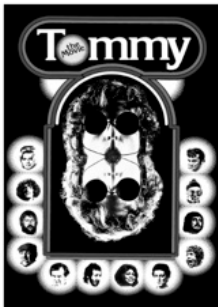

Female Trouble (1974) [97 min.]

Directed by John Waters

John Waters, Baltimore's Prince of Puke, returns for another riotously anarchic and decadently disgusting blast of scuzz. Divine plays Dawn Davenport, a delinquent bad-girl on a perverse path to Female Trouble in this epic ode to crime and beauty that tackles all the taboos, from pregnancy and prostitution to capital punishment and cha-cha heels. Also featuring Waters' regulars David Lochary, Mary Vivian Pearce, Mink Stole, and Edith Massey.

Tommy (1975) [111 min.]

Directed by Ken Russell

Your senses will never be the same! Iconoclastic auteur Ken Russell unleashes a star-studded fantasy based on The Who's concept album. In a rollicking & psychedelic rock opera, The Who's Roger Daltrey plays Tommy, a catatonic man turned unlikely pinball prodigy and messianic hero. Oliver Reed and Ann-Margret co-star alongside a host of musical luminaries.

Black Christmas (2006) [90 min.]

Terror comes home for a Black Christmas when a group of sorority sisters get stalked & slashed while snowed in over holiday break in this gruesome remake of the seminal slasher. Diving deep into a jaundiced killer's dark history, this update diverges dramatically from the original to show the hateful creation and horrific backstory that turned a boy into a deranged maniac.

The Thing (1982) [109 min.]

Directed by John Carpenter

In John Carpenter's claustrophobic horror whodunit, the crew of a remote Antarctic research center must fight for survival against an alien life form that can assimilate, then imitate, its host. And man is the warmest place to hide. Kurt Russell leads a stellar ensemble cast that also includes Wilford Brimley, T.K. Carter, David Clennon and Keith David, while Rob Bottin's jaw-dropping practical effects continue to shock and amaze.

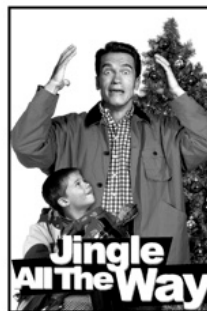
