Saturday • January 3 Aliens (1986) [137 min.]

Directed by James Cameron

When a deep-space salvage crew discovers an escape shuttle containing Ellen Ripley (Sigourney Weaver) decades after her first alien encounter, she'll accompany a team of marines back to where the terror started. Director James Cameron ratchets up the action in his high-tension follow-up to the Ridley Scott classic, crafting one of the most pounding adventures ever sent into space: thoroughly entertaining, eminently quotable, and jam-packed with a dream team cast and an impressive array of visual effects.



Saturday • January 10 Eraserhead (1977) [89 min.]

Directed by David Lynch

David Lynch's debut jawdropper is pure midnight movie magic, a landmark of the weird & wild, and a must-see touchstone for all cinematic explorers. Nearly five decades have done nothing to dull its spell; *Eraserhead* remains horrifyingly original and darkly humorous, a nightmarish landscape where stunning black and white cinematography, unsettling sound design, hallucinatory vision, and industrial score melt into subconscious abyss.

Directed by Adrian Lyne

The most frightening thing about Jacob Singer's nightmare is that he isn't dreaming. A Vietnam vet finds his sanity crumbling as hallucinations & flashbacks overtake his waking life. Will he be able to restore balance before he fully descends into madness? Tim Robbins stars in a disturbingly nightmarish brain-bender from director Adrian Lyne.



Saturday • January 24 The Texas Chainsaw Massacre 2 (1986) [101 min.]

Directed by Tobe Hooper

After a decade of silence... the buzzz is back. Director Tobe Hooper follows up his own landmark masterpiece with this supercharged splatter sequel, a deranged & darkly comedic funhouse of horrors.
