





Saturday • March 7 Harold and Maude (1971) [91 min.] Directed by Hal Ashby

They met at the funeral of a perfect stranger. From then on, things got perfectly stranger and stranger. Hal Asby's beloved black comedy is the perfect mix of macabre humor and sweet romance, following a young man adrift from his wealthy family, the death-obsessed Harold (Bud Cort), who finds love & friendship when he meets the eccentric, seventy-nine-year-old Maude (Ruth Gordon). Backed by the timeless music of Cat Stevens, Harold and Maude is a cult classic that will make you want to sing out.



Saturday • March 14 O Lucky Man! (1973) [178 min.]

Directed by Lindsay Anderson

Lindsay Anderson's sprawling, savagely funny socioeconomic satire stars a career-best Malcolm McDowell as an ambitious and wide-eyed coffee salesman on a series of surreal adventures - all backed to an incredible songtrack by Alan Price. A midnight movie staple at arthouses in the '70s & '80s, *O Lucky Man!* is unlike anything you've seen before; it's completely unpredictable, absurd, and as painfully relevant as ever.



Saturday • March 21 Where's Poppa? (1970) [88 min.]

Directed by Carl Reiner

George Segal stars as a put-upon attorney living with his aging mother, deliciously played by Ruth Gordon, in Carl Reiner's absurdist masterpiece Where's Poppa? Wishing he would have put her in a home ages ago, our sad sack hero finds himself hilariously in a pickle when he falls in love with his mother's new nurse, who doesn't much care for the old lady's shenanigans.



Saturday • March 28 Andy Warhol's Dracula (1974) [106 min.] Written and Directed by Paul Morrissey

Director Paul Morrissey and producer Andy Warhol present an outrageous mix of transgressive humor, 1970s sexuality, and graphic horror in their infamous take on the Dracula legend. In search of virgin blood to survive, an ailing Count (the incomparable Udo Kier) travels to Italy, where he's welcomed into the crumbling castle of a man desperate to marry off his daughters. But finding an unsullied bite may be difficult, especially with studly Warhol superstar Joe Dallesandro co-starring as the estate's Marxist handyman.

March 7 & 8 at 2:00pm Harry Potter and the Half-Blood Prince Directed by David Yates (2009) [153 min.]

With love in the air and romance blossoming, Harry enters his sixth year at Hogwarts. But his former school safe haven has new threats lurking around every corner. To prepare for the coming war, the teen wizard will have to unravel the mysteries of an old book and partner with his headmaster to unlock the key to the Dark Lord's defenses.



March 14 & 15 at 2:00pm Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows: Part 1 Directed by David Yates (2010) [146 min.]

Such a beautiful place, to be with friends. On their desperate quest to find and destroy the sources of Voldemort's powers, Harry, Ron, and Hermione must rely on each other, while dark forces threaten to tear them apart. The penultimate entry in the Potter series is the most brooding and bittersweet so far, perfectly preparing us for the final farewells ahead.



March 21 & 22 at 2:00pm Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows: Part 2 Directed by David Yates (2011) [130 min.]

It all ends here. In the thrilling, high-stakes finale to the epic saga, Harry and the wizarding world must face Lord Voldemort and his forces of darkness in one last fearsome battle between good and evil. It's an action-packed, visually stunning, and emotionally satisfying conclusion that also marked the end of an era for an entire generation.



March 28 & 29 at 2:00pm Matilda (1996) [98 min.] Directed by Danny DeVito

Get Down and Boogie {aka Darktown Strutters} (1975) [16mm]...

Once upon a time there was a girl named Matilda, who was extraordinary in every way. But in a world where grownups make all the rules, she'll have to discover a secret power within herself to help even the odds. In a spectacular adaptation of Roald Dahl's classic children's novel, Danny DeVito directs a charming, darkly comic fantasy for the whole family, featuring a spirited performance by Mara Wilson in the lead role and DeVito and Rhea Perlman as the worst parents ever.
