





The Last Waltz (1978) [116 min.]

Directed by Martin Scorsese

One of the all-time great music films, Martin Scorsese's *The Last Waltz* documents The Band's 1976 farewell concert appearance at the Winterland Ballroom in San Francisco, balancing electrifying performance footage with revealing interviews. Featuring timeless performances of The Band's biggest hits, beautifully shot by legendary cinematographer Michael Chapman, and an unparalleled lineup of special guest musicians, including Bob Dylan, Joni Mitchell, Neil Young, Emmylou Harris, and many more.

The Lost Boys (1987) [98 min.]

Directed by Joel Schumacher

Sleep all day. Party all night. It's fun to be a vampire in Joel Schumacher's slickly '80s rock 'n roll fang-fest. After moving to the sunny beachside town of Santa Carla, two brothers soon discover that blood suckers rule the boardwalk. Deftly mixing fun and frights with a killer soundtrack and an iconic cast (Jason Patric & Jami Gertz, both Coreys and a Kiefer), *The Lost Boys* gleefully delivers on ghoulish delights!

Invasion of the Body Snatchers (1978) [115 min.]

Directed by Philip Kaufman

The seed is planted, and terror grows when an invisible invasion causes a strange shift in the citizens of San Francisco, forcing a group of friends to question who - or what - has become of those around them. Director Philip Kaufman and screenwriter W.D. Richter expertly update the sci-fi classic and create a masterwork of post-hippie horror and paranoia, which Pauline Kael wrote "may be the best film of its kind ever made."



Saturday • August 28

Manhunter (1986) [120 min.]

Written and Directed by Michael Mann

Michael Mann's sharp, stylish adaptation of Thomas Harris' *Red Dragon* (the precursor to *Silence of the Lambs* and the introduction of Hannibal Lector), follows a former FBI profiler who returns to action to help track a deranged killer. But when he enlists an unlikely ally for help, it sparks a firestorm that could engulf everyone around him. Fresh off *To Live and Die in L.A.*, William Petersen provides an unforgettable performance in one of the best thrillers of the decade.


