**They Live** (1988) [94 min.]

Directed by John Carpenter

John Carpenter's sci-fi stunner has never been more relevant or smack down, drag-out entertaining as it is now! Working at the peak of his '80s prowess, Carpenter is firing on all cylinders as he crafts this tongue-in-cheek critique on consumer culture. Featuring an all-time great bare-knuckled street brawl, a pounding Alan Howarth score, and more Rowdy Roddy Piper one-liners than WrestleMania V, *They Live* is paranoid freakout fun that will have you questioning the world around you.

**Boogie Nights** (1997) [155 min.]

Directed by Paul Thomas Anderson

From acclaimed director Paul Thomas Anderson comes a tale of sex, drugs, and roller skates with an all-star cast! When porn director Jack Horner (Burt Reynolds) discovers "Dirk Diggler" (Mark Wahlberg), a high school dropout with tremendous potential, Dirk quickly becomes a prominent figure in the San Fernando sex scene. However, when the indulgence and expectations of the 70s give way to the competition and harsh reality of the 80s, Dirk discovers that the rapidly evolving industry won't wait for anyone, no matter how big a star.

**Friday** (1995) [91 min.]

Directed by F. Gary Gray

F. Gary Gray's energetic feature film debut is a laughable look at all that can go down between Thursday and Saturday, following two friends (Ice Cube and an electrically funny Chris Tucker) desperately trying to find some quick scratch to repay the local dope dealer - or else - while amusingly observing the goings-on of the memorable characters in their hood. Featuring a pitch-perfect supporting cast, including Bernie Mac, Johnny Witherspoon, Tiny 'Zeus' Lister, and Nia Long, *Friday* is a stoned-cold comedy classic propelled by an iconic soundtrack.

**Mulholland Dr.** (2001) [146 min.]

Directed by David Lynch

As the questions pile up and answers disappear, you'll discover things aren't always what they seem along Mulholland Drive. David Lynch's intoxicating fantasia is a Los Angeles nightmare, a neo-noir world of danger, dread, deep mystery, and dark humor, dismantling the Hollywood dream like pieces in a subconscious puzzle. Riveting performances from Naomi Watts and Laura Elena Harring anchor a narrative that nearly swallows itself whole, while a gorgeous score from Angelo Badalamenti keeps us consistently spellbound.

Directed by Gene Kelly and Stanley Donen


