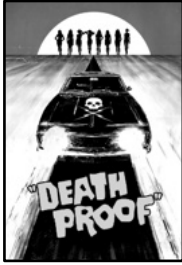
Saturday • June 1

Directed by John Carpenter

At the perfect intersection of ancient mysticism, rampaging maniacs and big rig trucking lays the best actor / director combo of the '80s having the most foot-flyin' fun of their illustrious careers. **Death Proof** (2007) [114 min.]  
Directed by Quentin Tarantino

Tighten your seat belt and prepare for a white-hot juggernaut at 200 miles per hour! The scarred, psychotic Stuntman Mike (Kurt Russell) is on the road, stalking women with his "death proof" wheels of terror. But the tables are about to turn in Quentin Tarantino's thrill-ride riff on the drive-in muscle car flicks of the 1970s.

**Night Warning** (1981) [93 min.]  
Directed by William Asher

In one of the wildest mind-shredders banned during the UK's notorious video nasty uproar, Susan Tyrrell (*Forbidden Zone*) gives one of the most unhinged performances in exploitation film history.
